Professional Development

Why, When, How and Where

Continuing research into quality early childhood education and childcare reports the positive impact of the professionalism of caregivers on the care and education of young children and their families. As with any professional endeavor, the more you know about what you are doing, the more likely you are to be doing it the best way possible, and of course having the best possible outcome.

The time for professional development is NOW. It is never too early or too late to expand your professionalism through workshops, college classes and advanced training.

Sign up for one of the workshops/training events offered throughout Larimer County. Attend a local, regional or perhaps even a national conference. Enroll in college classes at any of the colleges or universities in our area or take online classes. Join one of the professional organizations that support early childhood professionalism. Talk to others who are in the profession, share a book, talk about an article, discuss a problem you are trying to solve or a great idea you used successfully.

There are many options available for financial assistance and the Professional Development Office of the Early Childhood Council is available to help you. Request an application for a Temple Hoyne Buell Scholarship or Erion Scholarship (for Loveland residents), apply for a PELL grant through www.fafsa.ed.gov, obtain information on TEACH scholarship awards, apply for Colorado Opportunity Funds when you enroll in college classes and receive a voucher for reduced tuition.

Professional development takes many forms but the outcome is always the same: increased quality in the care and education you

offer to children and their families and an increased sense of pride in the “profession” you have chosen.

Certificates for Training

For each training sponsored by the Early Childhood Council, a certificate will be issued for completion of the training. The amount of clock hours each training is worth is listed under the training description. For a participant who does not complete the entire training, a certificate will not be issued. Your child care licensing specialist must determine if any training meets the licensing requirements.

Every Child Ready to Read

Reading well is the foundation of school success. Children who learn six critical pre-reading skills before they start kindergarten become better readers. Children who do not know these skills when they come to school have a much more difficult time learning to read. This program explains why the six early literacy skills are so important in learning to read, demonstrates how to help children learn the skills, provides titles of high-interest books that are age appropriate, and sends parents and caregivers home with early literacy activities they can incorporate into their daily routine.

This group of policy makers was convened by the Center for Human Investment Policy as the Colorado Early Childhood Professional Development Advisory Council. One of the outcomes of this group was the establishment
